SUBJECT:	Sphere of Influence Review and Update: LAFCo 22-03S Camarillo Sanitary District

Recommendations:

- A. Determine that the sphere of influence update for the Camarillo Sanitary District (District) is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to § 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.
- B. Review and update the sphere of influence for the District pursuant to Government Code § 56425(g).
- C. Adopt Resolution LAFCo 22-03S (Attachment 4) making determinations and updating the sphere of influence for the District.

Background:

Pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Government Code § 56000 et seq.), the Commission was required to determine and adopt a sphere of influence (or "sphere") for each city and special district on or before January 1, 2008. A sphere of influence is defined in Government Code § 56076 as the probable physical boundary and service area of a local agency, as determined by the Commission. Every five years thereafter, the Commission must, as necessary, review and update each sphere of influence (Government Code § 56425(g)). Before it may update an agency's sphere, LAFCo is required to conduct a Municipal Service Review (MSR) pursuant to Government Code § 56430.

In compliance with Government Code § 56425(g), the Commission accepted an MSR report on September 17, 2003, for the District, entitled *Water and Wastewater Municipal Service Review Report*, which addressed agencies within the Calleguas Creek Watershed.

LAFCo's past sphere of influence reviews resulted in the following: (1) an update of the sphere in 2004, (2) a review (i.e., no changes) of the sphere in 2009, and (3) an update of the sphere in 2014.

Discussion:

District Information

The Camarillo Sanitary District is a dependent special district formed in 1955 that provides:

- (1) wastewater collection and treatment service, and
- (2) industrial waste pretreatment service.

Its service area is located within and surrounding the City of Camarillo (or "City"). The Camarillo City Council is the governing body of the District. The District's sphere of influence covers approximately 11,806 acres (about 18.5 square miles) (see Attachment 1). The sphere is largely aligned with the sphere of the City of Camarillo. The areas that are outside the District's boundaries, but within its sphere, are either already being served by the District or are contemplated by the City for urban development.

Recommended Sphere of Influence Update and Analysis

A sphere of influence update is defined in Section 4.1.2(b) of the Ventura LAFCo Commissioner's Handbook as "a comprehensive review and modification of a sphere of influence that is not associated with a concurrent proposal for a change of organization or an out of agency service agreement."

Based on the work plan established by the Commission, review/update of the District's sphere of influence was to be initiated during 2019. During 2019, LAFCo staff consulted with the District's general manager to discuss the sphere of influence, and to determine: (1) if the District has experienced any changes to its service needs or areas since LAFCo's most recent evaluation of its sphere of influence, and (2) if the District staff anticipates any service changes that would warrant adjustment of the sphere boundaries. The following discussion provides a summary of Commission actions regarding sphere of influence reviews/updates pertaining to the District, and explains why an update to the District's sphere is now appropriate.

On May 19, 2004, (in response to LAFCo's September 17, 2003, MSR prepared for the District), the Commission updated the District's sphere of influence, expanding it in two locations to align the District sphere with the Camarillo City Urban Restriction Boundary (CURB)¹.

¹ Subject to the City's Save Open Space and Agricultural Resources (SOAR) ordinance, the CURB establishes a boundary within which voter approval is generally required prior to the extension of City services or a change in general plan designation.

On January 21, 2009, the Commission reviewed, but did not update, the District's sphere of influence.

On November 19, 2014, the Commission updated the District's sphere to exclude 303 acres of unincorporated land that had been contemplated for development in the City as part of the proposed Conejo Creek Specific Plan project, but the Camarillo City Council terminated processing of the application on September 10, 2014. Because development of the project site was no longer imminent or foreseeable, the need for sewer service to the site was no longer anticipated.

In response to the contents of the MSR prepared for the District for consideration by the Commission at today's meeting, staff provides the following evaluation of the District's sphere of influence. At this time, staff recommends that the Commission update the District's sphere, resulting in a reduction of the sphere through the exclusion of a 6.79-acre area located adjacent to the northeast corner of Somis Road and Upland Road, in the northeastern portion of the District and entirely within the City of Camarillo (Assessor's Parcel Numbers 163-0-071-16 (portion), -21 (portion), -22 (portion), -24 (portion) and -26), as depicted in Attachments 2 and 3. Removal of this area from the sphere is appropriate because the District has no plans to serve areas within Calleguas Creek (which comprises the vast majority of the area to be removed from the sphere), and it excludes an access road that is a portion of an agricultural parcel immediately to its north. The existing sphere of influence boundary otherwise continues to reflect the District's current and probable service area, and is justified based on the MSR report² which demonstrates that the District has the ability to provide its services at acceptable levels.

District staff have reviewed the recommended sphere update and have no objections.

Written Determinations

Government Code § 56425(e) requires that, in determining the sphere of influence of an agency, the Commission consider and prepare a written statement of its determinations with respect to each of the following:

(1) The present and planned land uses in the area, including agricultural and open-space lands.
(§ 56425(e)(1))

The 6.79-acre property to be removed from the District's sphere is entirely within the City of Camarillo and has City General Plan designations of *Agriculture, Natural Open Space*, and *Linkage* (roadways and waterway). Based on the characteristics of the territory, the existing use of the land is expected to remain unchanged.

² The MSR report is included as Agenda Item 15 for Commission consideration at the Commission's February 16, 2022, meeting. The staff recommendation regarding the sphere of influence is based, in part, on the information provided in the draft MSR report.

(2) The present and probable need for public facilities and services in the area. (§ 56425(e)(2))

The District does not provide urban services to the land area recommended for removal from the sphere as part of the recommended sphere update. The property is not expected to require the provision of District services, and is anticipated to remain in its current undeveloped land use for the foreseeable future, based on its City General Plan designation and location within Calleguas Creek. Therefore, there appears to be no need for municipal services from the District within the area in the foreseeable future.

(3) The present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the agency provides or is authorized to provide. (§ 56425(e)(3))

The sphere of influence update, as recommended, would reduce the size of the District's sphere of influence. Therefore, it would not result in new demands on the District that would adversely impact the present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the District provides or is authorized to provide.

(4) The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if the commission determines that they are relevant to the agency. (§ 56425(e)(4))

The recommended update to the District's sphere of influence does not involve territory that is known to be a community of interest. Therefore, the sphere of influence update would not result in a detrimental impact to any social or economic communities of interest.

(5) For an update of a sphere of influence of a city or special district that provides public facilities or services related to sewers, municipal and industrial water, or structural fire protection. . . the present and probable need for those public facilities and services of any disadvantaged unincorporated communities within the existing sphere of influence. (§ 56425(e)(5))

The District's current sphere of influence does not include either of the two communities that the Commission determined met the definition of a disadvantaged unincorporated community (i.e., Nyeland Acres and Saticoy) (Ventura LAFCo Commissioner's Handbook Section 3.2.5). Therefore, the recommended sphere update will not result in changes to available service within any disadvantaged unincorporated communities.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

A project is defined in CEQA § 21065, in part, as "an activity which may cause either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment." The subject sphere of influence update is considered to be a project subject to CEQA because it involves a net reduction to the existing sphere boundary, which will reduce the

However, it is recommended that the Commission find that the reduction in the District's sphere of influence is exempt from CEQA pursuant to § 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, because "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." No change in regulation, land use, or development will occur as a result of the recommended sphere of influence update.







RESOLUTION OF THE VENTURA LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION MAKING DETERMINATIONS AND UPDATING THE SPHERE OF INFLUENCE FOR THE CAMARILLO SANITARY DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Government Code § 56425 et seq. requires the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo or Commission) to develop and determine the sphere of influence of each local governmental agency within the County; and

WHEREAS, Government Code § 56425(g) requires that on or before January 1, 2008, and every five years thereafter, the Commission shall, as necessary, review and update the sphere of influence of each city and special district; and

WHEREAS, the Commission updated the sphere of influence for the Camarillo Sanitary District (District) in 2004, reviewed the sphere in 2009, and updated the sphere in 2014;

WHEREAS, the Commission desires to update the sphere of influence for the District; and

WHEREAS, no change in regulation, land use, or development will occur as a result of updating the sphere of influence for the District; and

WHEREAS, at the times and in the manner required by law, the LAFCo Executive Officer gave notice of the consideration of this item by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the sphere of influence update item was duly considered at a public hearing on February 16, 2022, as specified in the notice of hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Commission heard, discussed, and considered all oral and written testimony for and against the sphere of influence update including, but not limited to, the LAFCo Staff Report dated February 16, 2022, and recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the Commission accepted the Municipal Service Review report for the District dated February 16, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Commission as follows:

- (1) The LAFCo Staff Report dated February 16, 2022, and recommended update of the sphere of influence for the District are adopted; and
- (2) The subject sphere of influence update is assigned the following distinctive short form designation:

LAFCO 22-03S CAMARILLO SANITARY DISTRICT SPHERE OF INFLUENCE UPDATE; and

- (3) The sphere of influence update for the District is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to § 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, and LAFCo staff is directed to file a Notice of Exemption as the lead agency pursuant to § 15062 of the CEQA Guidelines; and
- (4) The Commission has considered the criteria set forth in Government Code § 56425(e) and determines as follows:

a. The present and planned land uses in the area, including agricultural and openspace lands. (§ 56425(e)(1))

The 6.79-acre property to be removed from the District's sphere is entirely within the City of Camarillo and has City General Plan designations of *Agriculture*, *Natural Open Space*, and *Linkage* (roadways and waterway). Based on the characteristics of the territory, the existing use of the land is expected to remain unchanged.

b. The present and probable need for public facilities and services in the area. (§ 56425(e)(2))

The District does not provide urban services to the land area recommended for removal from the sphere as part of the recommended sphere update. The property is not expected to require the provision of District services, and is anticipated to remain in its current undeveloped land use for the foreseeable future, based on its City General Plan designation and location within Calleguas Creek. Therefore, there appears to be no need for municipal services from the District within the area in the foreseeable future.

- d. The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if the commission determines that they are relevant to the agency. (§ 56425(e)(4)) The recommended update to the District's sphere of influence does not involve territory that is known to be a community of interest. Therefore, the sphere of influence update would not result in a detrimental impact to any social or economic communities of interest.
- e. For an update of a sphere of influence of a city or special district that provides public facilities or services related to sewers, municipal and industrial water, or structural fire protection. . . the present and probable need for those public facilities and services of any disadvantaged unincorporated communities within the existing sphere of influence. (§ 56425(e)(5))

The District's current sphere of influence does not include either of the two communities that the Commission determined met the definition of a disadvantaged unincorporated community (i.e., Nyeland Acres and Saticoy) (Ventura LAFCo Commissioner's Handbook Section 3.2.5). Therefore, the recommended sphere update will not result in changes to available service within any disadvantaged unincorporated communities.

(5) The sphere of influence for the District is hereby updated as generally depicted in Exhibit A, "Camarillo Sanitary District – Sphere of Influence Update, February 16, 2022," attached hereto; and

(6) LAFCo staff is directed to have the official Geographic Information System (GIS) sphere of influence data maintained for the Ventura LAFCo by the Ventura County Information Technology Services Department as the official sphere of influence record for the Camarillo Sanitary District updated consistent with this action. This resolution was adopted on February 16, 2022.

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
